## Some Close-Ups On The Sport Screen

Unless Delta and Liberty Center high school football teams prove unusually strong this season, Bryan's schedule is well planned for the Defiance contest in that city on Armistice day. It is designed to give two fairly easy contests on weeks preceding the Defiance encounter. Delta is to play on the Bryan gridiron, Oct. 29 and Liberty Center on Nov. 5.

Defiance will play Bryan's third game before the close of the schedule. The Williams county seat lads will play at Montpelier on Nov. 19 and will play abroad to close the year with the Napoleon squad.

Bryan will open its schedule on Oct. 1, with either Stryker or Edon at Bryan. Wauseon, Bowling Green and Leipsic will then come on following weeks, each of these games being played on foreign fields.

Weight is lacking in the Bryan squad, so Coach Rufus Scales will depend on speed to make up the handicap. The backfield will tip the scales at an average of 140 pounds a man, while the line will be 20 pounds lighter, according to present indications. Only one lineman of last year is in this year's squad. The entire backfield will be back. The problem is to build a line that will enable the runners to work.

Of interest to Defiance is the fact that the Bowling Green State Normal football squad will report for duty today for the first time when coaches will commence building the eleven which later will meet the Defiance College Yellow Jackets in a Northwest Ohio conference engagement. Forty candidates, with much veteran timber in the list, are expected to be present at the initial drill.
