that event is being run. Woods also set the mark in the 300 meter low hurdles as his 41.45 broke the mark set by Napoleon's Vern Oberhaus last season.

Rick Ross of Wauseon won the high hurdles (16.01), Todd Myers, also of Wauseon, successfully defended his 100-yard dash title by winning in 10.81. Delta's Tim Basich won the 220 in 23.94 and the foursome of Steve Rings, Ken Imm, John Thornton and Denny Devers won the mile relay for Montpelier in 3:37.63.

The Swanton girls also used their overall team depth to take the title. The Bulldogs won three times Tuesday and had runners finish in the top four in six of the remaining events.

STEPHANIE EATON, last year's Class AA 880 champ, won that event Tuesday in a record time of 2:26.02. The record was one of six set in the girls portion of the meet.

Swanton's Lisa Dietsch won the 100 meter hurdles in 17.51 and the mile relay squad of Amy Tapola, Laurie Culler, Laura Redd and Eaton also won a NWOAL title. The relay team's time of 4:25.06 is a new league record.

Other records set in the girls meet included: the Montpelier medley relay of Shelly Engels, Kim Cheadla, Diane Bible and Denise Starr (1:58.84), Jackie Schweitzer of Bryan in the mile (5:33.70), the Archbold 880 relay of Sheryl Lauber, Beth Wyse, Julie Garber and Janet Dilbons (1:53.67) and the Evergreen 440 relay of Sue Miller, Laura Szabo, Kristi Pilliod and Dawn Hudik (53.32).

Shelly Engels, of Montpelier, copped first in the 100 with a time of 12.17, Denise Starr, of Montpelier, won the 440 in 62.14 and Hudik won the 220 in 27.60.
