

Bryan Bears Grab Lead In NWOL Meet

BRYAN — Bryan High School's defending champions were setting the pace in the Northwest Ohio League's track meet, after the first day of competition.

Three events were completed Tuesday. Bryan picked up 16 points and was followed by Liberty Center with 10, Napoleon 9, Delta 7, Montpelier 5 and Swanton 1. Wauseon was unable to register a point.

The meet will be completed today, with the finals in 11 events on the docket.

Two new records were set Tuesday in the preliminaries in the discus toss and low hurdles. Both marks will go into the books unless bettered today in the finals.

Bryan's Jim Ginther got off a discus toss of 137' ½" to snap the league and Park Stadium marks. The former NWOL record * was 133' 9" and was established in 1949 by Lyle Storrer of Montpelier.

Delta's Dick Taylor hopped over the low hurdles in 14 seconds flat. The old mark was 14.2, set by Bob Lett in 1930.
